FROM PASTOR VERA...

SAY GOODBYE. STAY PUT. WAIT PATIENTLY.

Mark and I have not had the privilege of having our own children. To be sure, I have nurtured and pastored lots of babies, children and youth but none that I have had to send into the world like parents do when their kids are grown.

It must take amazing fortitude and courage for you to entrust your children to their own selves as you send them into the world. While I know how excited kids are for their futures to unfold, I don't know how those of you who are parents muster the strength to say goodbye. And you must wonder as you bid them farewell if they remember everything you taught them...all the values and morals you have spent years instilling in their hearts and souls. Will they remember the ethics of their childhood home...will they continue to know how deeply they are loved?

During a continuing ed program I did some years ago on Family Systems, we talked about interdependence and self-differentiation and the importance of achieving both. As I listened to the lecture it occurred to me that we must let our children go or they will never become what they are supposed to become. My tendency would be to hang on to my loved ones with all my might.

Christi Himmelfahrt's **Tag** in the **Protestant Church in Germany** is a pretty big deal. How in the world can we welcome the Spirit without saying goodbye to Jesus first? The Ascension is the goodbye that Jesus and his disciples experience before the Day of Pentecost and the powerful outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The Ascension was Jesus' farewell and provides a memorable conclusion to Luke's gospel only to be reiterated at the beginning of the book of Acts. It functions a bit like the way a television show will show you scenes from the previous week before a new episode begins.

As Jesus ascends, the disciples are told to wait. "Stay in the city," he says. "Wait in Jerusalem for the promise of the Father." It's a funny request from someone who is about to leave you. Stay. Wait. And in one sure sign that they are already maturing in their faith, the disciples actually listen to Jesus.

Secondly, they are told what they are waiting for – power. "Stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high ... You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you." The disciples are promised the gift of the Holy Spirit.

And finally, that power, when it comes, will hurl them out as witnesses to all they have seen and heard. Acts makes it perfectly clear — "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." They will be sent to tell the story to every corner of the known world.

In some ways the Ascension is like a child learning to ride a bike. Just after the training wheels come off, a parent or friend runs behind for a while to steady the bike, making sure they maintain their balance. But eventually, in order for the new bike rider to take off, one needs to let go. Unless the teacher lets the learner go, they will never become what they are supposed to become...they will never learn to ride unless the teacher sends them down the road and into the world.

You know this scenario well. Once your children are grown, you send them out with your blessing and hope they will become all that you nurtured them to be and all that God hopes they will be. But they are not sent alone nor are we. They and you and I have been called to be Christ's witnesses of love, grace and joy...not just where you are comfortable like in our beautiful church but as Jesus commands it...to the ends of the earth.

I can't wait for Pentecost Sunday and the Feast Day we will celebrate next Sunday. But first we must say goodbye, stay put, and wait patiently to receive power from on high. \odot


