FROM PASTOR VERA... I AM THE VINE; YOU ARE THE BRANCHES

After I retired I withdrew from corporate worship and often didn't care if I attended a Sunday morning service. After twenty challenging, stressful and very busy years at Evergreen Lutheran, I needed a break. Oh to be sure, Mark and I would occasionally sit in front of the computer or TV and take in a virtual worship but for a long time I didn't step foot in a church building. Frankly, I was happy to be done for a while. However, the longer we stayed away, the weaker my faith became and my love for the church and her people diminished.

This Sunday's Gospel lesson takes place shortly before Jesus is crucified. Jesus certainly knew what was ahead of him and that serious pruning was on the horizon for himself as well as for his disciples. Although he could have been consumed with his own dark destiny, his concern instead was that his disciples would remember the importance of sticking together when those challenging times were upon them. They would need to remain grafted into the Vine even though Jesus would



no longer be physically present. And they would certainly need each other for strength to survive and courage to press ahead.

Community, interrelationship, mutuality, and dwelling together are what keep God's people alive. Jesus knew this, and he needed his disciples to trust it as well. It is the community that gives an individual their best chance at producing the powerful fruits of love.

Unfortunately, we are applauded when we make it on our own. We've been taught that we need to stand on our own two feet. Autonomy and privatism are the name of the game.

Having it your own way ... when you want it ... how you want it is terribly seductive. Susan Hedahl suggests that if we carry the autonomy and privatism into the spiritual life, that principle can have devastating results. It's what Parker Palmer once described as a "free floating spirituality." It's a spirituality that values personal faith over communal power.

In free-floating spirituality dependency and inter-relatedness are rarely valued to the extent that individualism is. Today our Gospel lesson flies in the face of such attitudes with a very different type of invitation to reliance on God. At the heart of the Johannine model is social interrelationship and corporate accountability. The vine and branches metaphor exhorts the community to steadfastness in its abiding in Jesus and in its relationship to each other. Walking away from both are life threatening. And yet so many of us walk away when things don't bend to our satisfaction, when things don't go our way. We'd rather move on than stay close to the source of our strength. We'd rather wash our hands of relational responsibility than tackle the hard work of communal life.

Brothers and sisters, the Christian community is a lifeline for our walk with Jesus. It is the touchstone of life in Christ. To those of you who have left StPLC due to the struggles of the past year, it's time to come home. The church needs you and you need the community of the body of Christ. Staying connected to the Vine and collectively receiving nourishment from it and from each other is what will sustain and grow your faith. We need each other.

FIREARM HARM REDUCTION SERIES, TODAY 10:15 - 11:45 A.M.

Our Coffee and Conversation on firearm harm reduction concludes today. Last Sunday, Jessica Buck Atkinson from the Colorado School of Public Health, Colorado Firearm Injury Prevention Initiative presented information about firearms in Colorado, the types and prevalence of firearm injuries and deaths and public health approaches to reducing firearm harm. Pastor Michael, a South Dakota native, spent 18 years as a pastor at Holy Shepherd Lutheran Church in Lakewood. He spent most of 2023 as the interim pastor at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in

Cheyenne. Since that position concluded, he has been a caregiver with Visiting Angels. Pastor Michael earned his Master of Divinity degree at Pacific Theological Lutheran Seminary in Berkeley, Calif. He has a degree in psychology from Colorado State University. He is deeply interested in

photography as a spiritual medium. The pastor and his wife, Linda, have been married for 35 years. They have two children.

From his rostered minister profile, Pastor Michael shares some ideas on his pastoral competencies:

PASTORAL CARE AND VISITATION

"Words of divine wisdom from my pastoral care professor continually ring in my

being when I enter into a pastoral care situation, 'Always remember, Michael: You're important ... but you're not.' Pastoral care has always been a top priority in my sense of call. I experience those moments as "Holy Places," where I am very aware that what God does in these times reaches FAR beyond any skills or abilities that I bring into the picture. AND I believe God has gifted me with the ability to be present with people in ways that give God an opportunity to transform lives."

PREACHING / WORSHIP / LEADERSHIP

"As a worship leader, I strive to lead with authenticity, honesty, personal integrity all while inviting the gathered to experience the Holy. My preaching is informed by God's living word for the sake of God's people. Meaning, proclaiming God's Good News is only good news if it is heard as pertinent in the lives of the community. I'm drawn to the original form of sharing God's Word, by telling stories while continuing the story."

SPIRITUAL FORMATION / DIRECTION

"While on my most recent sabbatical, I invited the congregation to embark with me, into a time intentionally utilizing a spiritual practice of their choosing. My spiritual practice was photography and through this practice I created a devotional book that was shared with the congregation."

MINISTRY IN DAILY LIFE




