

Pastor: We praise you for the gift of water that sustains life, and above all we praise you


for the gift of new life in Jesus Christ. Shower us with your Spirit, and renew our lives with your forgiveness, grace, and love. To you be given honor and praise





Preface

Pastor:

It is indeed right and good that we should everywhere and always offer thanks and praise to you, Holy God, mighty and immortal, through Christ, our Lord. The day of your final Jubilee dawned in your Son, Jesus, your Anointed One who announced good news to the poor, bound up the broken-hearted, and set the captive free. And so with earth, sky, and sea and all their creatures, with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Eucharistic Prayer

Pastor: O Holy God, we give you thanks that on this day we have seen the resurrected

face of our Savior and Redeemer Jesus Christ. Through all generations you

have sustained your people with new life;

In the chaos of the flood you gave a sign of promise. To the barrenness Abraham and Sarah you gave a child. In Egypt you heard Israel cry and liberated your people. In the wilderness you upheld their life with daily bread. In exile you promised your people the hope of a new land. And in Jesus you revealed the depth of your forgiving love.

In the night in which he was betrayed, Our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks, Broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take and eat! This is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink saying, This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

We praise you for bringing your people through slavery, exile, and the wilderness giving faith to all to proclaim your death and resurrection:

People: Christ had died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again.

Pastor: Send you Spirit upon those gathered for this glorious feast and upon the

body and blood of your Son. Lead us this day out of the darkness of the tomb to the glory of resurrection light. Through him, with him, in him through the unity of the Holy Spirit all glory, honor, deliverance, and mercy are yours

now and forever.

People: Amen.

Lord's Prayer (*Pray in the language or translation of your choice.*)

Pastor: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us:

For thine is the kingdom, and the power and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Come and eat at God's table.



Distribution of the Sacrament


