FROM PASTOR VERA... "YOU ARE PRECIOUS IN MY SIGHT"

Good Shepherd Sunday is a favorite of mine, perhaps yours, too. In John chapter ten we hear Jesus speak incredible words of comfort. "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep....²⁷My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand."

I have a pretty distinct voice – one that probably gets a little annoying now and then, a little nasally, a little low and a little obnoxious when I get angry or frustrated. It's so distinct that Dr. Robert Kolb, one of my Missouri Synod college professors, identified me by my voice 13 years after I had last spoken with him. I needed an endorsement to complete my schooling for a Master's of Divinity for ordination in the ELCA. So, I called my old professor friend for a reference. After I said "hello Dr. Kolb" – before I could say my name – he said, "Hello Vera,

I've been waiting years for this call."

Voices are unique, distinct, and can either bless or repel us, lead us toward or away from a place of safety and peace. In his book about Martin Luther King, Jr., *Bearing the Cross*, David Garrow tells of a time in King's life when many voices competed for King's attention - voices of fear, of doubt, of despair. King received numerous murderous threats against him and his family. One night, the phone rang with yet another anonymous caller breathing murderous warnings.

After the call, King sat at the kitchen table, fearful but prayerful. He prayed to God, admitting that he was losing his courage. He heard a voice he knew was the voice of Jesus. "Martin," the voice said, "stand up for righteousness. Stand up for justice. Stand up for truth. And, lo,

I will be with you, even unto the end of the world." Strengthened by the voice, he knew which path to take and gained courage in his ministry. "Almost at once," he remembered, "my fears began to go. My uncertainty disappeared."

The last two Wednesday evenings I attended Confirmation class with Steve Leighton, Nate Gerhart and our confirmation-aged youth. We have spent time talking and studying about war and peace, suicide and hope. Throughout my ministry I have been consistently concerned about the voices our young people hear and listen to. They may be lured by the voices of society that lead them astray from the Good Shepherd; voices that question their worth or inner beauty. Voices that lead even to immorality or unethical behavior.

We are all surrounded by influential voices. How do we know which is the voice of God, rather than of Society, the Superego, self-interest, greed or insecurity? Hold the voice you hear and the direction that voice is calling you up against the life and ministry and love of Jesus.

If we follow when the Shepherd calls, there will be peace. Even through difficulty or suffering, "through the valley of the shadow of death ... we will fear no evil." Because, as Isaiah writes, God says, "Do not fear ... I have called you by name ... When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned ... For I am the Lord your God ... you are precious in my sight."

It is my prayer today that we listen intently for the voice of the great Shepherd who calls us to the table where goodness and mercy flow abundantly and who calls us to dwell in this house, Saint Peter, Christ's church forever. It is here, if we open our hearts to it, that we will find comfort and peace. There is no other voice that we should heed except the one that calls us today and every day to abundant and gracious life.


PRAYER OF THE DAY

FIREARM HARM REDUCTION SERIES, TODAY 10:30 - 11:45 A.M.

On Sunday, April 14th, **Aimee Alcorn** and **Toni Herr** from the **Colorado Dream Foundation** came to the Coffee and Conversation series to help us better understand trauma, the different types and causes of trauma. Aimee and Teri helped us to think about the many events including accidents, violence, loss and deprivation that can threaten or harm people and cause trauma. Like physical wounds, emotional wounds need time and care to heal. We explored how we at Saint Peter can provide a safe space for people to feel welcomed, safe and supported to heal and grow through trauma.

The conversation on April 14th was the first in a series on **Firearm Harm Reduction**. We began the series with a session on trauma to help us be mindful that our experience of trauma can influence our discussion on firearms.


Today, Jessica Buck-Atkinson, MPH, from the *Colorado School* of *Public Health Firearm Harm Reduction Initiative*, will present research and survey data on firearms in Colorado, including firearm ownership in Colorado, motivations to ownership, firearm use and safety behaviors among firearm owners. They will also present data on firearm-involved injury and harm in Colorado, such as domestic violence, suicide, community violence, school/ public shootings. This information will lay the groundwork for the session on April 28th.

A FACILITATED CONVERSATION ON FIREARMS AND INJURY PREVENTION

Community Engagement Staff from the *University of Colorado Firearm Injury Prevention Initiative* will guide us in discussions about our personal values and opinions of firearms and how we can find common goals to prevent firearm-related harm. Two facilitators with different backgrounds and perspectives on guns will be modeling and facilitating ways to engage in respectful dialogue.
